

Job Creation Partnerships is an employment program that works with employers to deliver job specific projects that create workplace-based work experience and skills enhancement for eligible individuals. Projects should benefit the participant, community and the local economy, however, the primary focus must be on helping the participant.

Program Objective

At the end of their participation in a **Job Creation Partnership** project, the participants will have recent work experience and additional skills to add to their resumes, increasing their chances of successfully finding long-term employment. Project activities funded through Job Creation Partnerships must be finite and incremental to the on-going operation of the project sponsor.

Who can apply?

The following organizations are eligible to provide work experience and receive funding as sponsors through this program:

- Businesses
- Non-profit organizations
- Crown corporations
- Municipalities or provincial/territorial governments
- First Nations councils
- Public health and educational institutions

Financial Benefits

Project applicants may be reimbursed for overhead costs incurred (e.g. materials and supplies, rental of equipment and other eligible expenses negotiated with program officials).

How do I apply?

Sponsors/community coordinators seeking funding under Job Creation Partnerships should complete the form “**HSD5209 - Application for Funding Form**” and submit it to the nearest Employment and Labour Market Services office.
